

CHAPTER TWO

William Franklin Nichols and Descendants

Generation No. 2

1. WILLIAM FRANKLIN³ NICHOLS (JOHN², UNKNOWN¹) was born August 01, 1794 in the state of Virginia, and died March 05, 1847 in New Providence, Boone County, Missouri. He married **MARY A. ROUNDTREE** June 24, 1823 in Barren County, Kentucky, daughter of SAMUEL ROUNDTREE and SUSANNA RICHARDSON. She was born February 05, 1808 in the state of Kentucky, and died February 28, 1870 in New Providence, Boone County, Missouri.

Notes for WILLIAM FRANKLIN NICHOLS:

William Franklin Nichols was the oldest child of John and Nancy (Burch) Nichols. He would have been just 11 years old when his family left Virginia, crossed through the Cumberland Gap to settle in Mercer County, Kentucky. By the time his father purchased land in Barren County and built what would become their permanent home on Fallen Timber Creek, William would have been about 18 years old, already a young man.

William Nichols appeared for the first time on the tax rolls for Barren County, Kentucky in the year 1817, where he was shown as the owner of 200 acres of land located on the waters of Fallen Timber Creek. He was 23 years old at the time and still a single man, and his land was located next to his father's 200 acre tract. Evidently, he relinquished his property shortly thereafter because when he next appeared on the county tax rolls four years later, in 1821, he was shown as owning no land. Perhaps it was at this time that William Nichols decided he wanted to be a carpenter and wagon builder and not a farmer. In 1823, his name reappeared on the Barren County tax rolls as the owner of one town lot, located in the town of Glasgow, and one mare horse. On June 24, 1823, he married Mary Roundtree, the daughter of Samuel and Susannah Roundtree. At the time of their marriage William was almost 29 years old, and Mary was barely 15. In 1824, William Nichols paid taxes on two town lots in Glasgow as well as one mare horse, one two-wheel carriage, and one black slave. The last year that William was named on the Barren tax rolls was 1825, when he was shown as the owner of two town lots in Glasgow, one black slave, and five horses. (Note: This reference to one slave owned by William Nichols in 1824 and 1825 is the only known occurrence of slave ownership by any of John Nichols' family).

William F. Nichols was a carpenter by trade, and at some point in the mid 1820's he and Mary made the decision to leave Kentucky and head west to the state of Missouri. The exact time of their departure, however, is unclear. On February 10, 1824, William purchased a wagon and team of five horses, which seems to suggest that he was considering a move at that time. However, they were still residing in Barren County some 14 months later, because their first child, Elvin J. Nichols, was born there on April 29, 1825. In all probability they departed the area shortly after Elvin's birth, because William Nichols' name never appeared again on the county tax rolls after 1825. Their second child, James T. Nichols, was born in January of 1827, and he always listed his birthplace as the state of Missouri. However, their third child, Virginia Nichols, who was born about 1828, gave her birthplace as Kentucky. According to "The History of Buchanan County, Missouri" (1881), Mary Nichols' parents, Samuel and Susannah Roundtree, migrated to Missouri from Barren County in 1828, settling in Boone County, where they would reside until 1837, at

which time they moved on to Buchanan County. It's very possible that William and Mary Nichols traveled from Kentucky to Missouri accompanied by her parents. In "The History of Boone County, Missouri," (1882) by James Rollins, the author states that the Nichols family arrived in Boone County, settling in Perche Township in December of 1829.

In a mortgage deed recorded on February 10, 1824, William "Nicholds" purchased from William Logan a wagon and team of five horses for the sum of \$163.00, for which were executed three notes of \$54.31 each, payable one, two and three years after the date of the mortgage. Logan had purchased the wagon, gear, and horses at a public sale in Munfordville, in neighboring Hart County, which were sold as the property of Samuel Roundtree, William's father-in-law. (Deed Book J, page 359, Barren County Clerk's Office.) The purchase of a wagon and team seems to indicate that the couple was planning ahead for their trip west.

The following is an excerpt from an article copied from the Glasgow Daily Times, dated 1939:

"William Nichols married Mary Roundtree of this county and left his Barren County home and set out to Missouri with his wife and young son in a covered wagon. The exact date of his leaving is uncertain, from the date that this writer has at hand, but there is an old record on file in the courthouse that makes us feel we know just about when he left for it was then that hundreds of early Kentuckians were once again surging with longing for the pioneer trail, as wagon train after wagon train answered the call of new territory and set out toward far horizons.

"On February 10, 1824, Wm. Nichols bought himself a wagon and team, consisting of five horses. Since the wagon route was the only method by which Missouri could be reached from Kentucky at that date, and since Wm. Nichols is not mentioned after that date in the records, as a citizen of Barren County, it is but reasonable to assume that he departed sometime within the next years.

"More than a century has passed since then, yet this record makes Wm. Nichols seem very real and vital to us of this day for the record is so descriptive that we can almost visualize him and his outfit as he bid his family a long farewell and the grandmother and grandfather Nichols gazed tremulously at the little grandson whom perhaps they would never see again, after the wagon had faded into the sunset for the way was long and beset with perils.

"The record states that the wagon and team were bought of William Logan...."which wagon and gear and five horses being the same said Logan purchased at auction at Munfordville which was sold as the property of Samuel Roundtree and the horses are of the following description: one large chestnut sorrel horse, one young bay colored horse mixed with white hairs, one bay mare, and one younger bay mare with some white on her face."

"We wondered why he bought five horses instead of four or six, and then we heard it expressed that one extra horse besides those hitched to take the wagon was always taken along on such journeys to help pull the wagon out of numerous mud holes encountered and to often be ridden ahead of the wagon to pick the best trail for the wagon to follow, or to be on the watch out for roving bands of Indians, so that the wagon could be hidden among trees until the danger had passed."

William Franklin Nichols died in Boone County, Missouri on March 5, 1847 at the age of 52 years old and was buried in that county in the New Providence Baptist Church Cemetery. His widow, Mary, was only 39 years old when William died leaving her with 11 or 12 children to raise. Since William Nichols died intestate (without a will) his oldest son, Elvin, almost 22 years old at the time, was appointed the administrator of his father's estate by the Boone County Circuit Court. An inventory of his father's personal property was made by Elvin, which was then recorded by the court on March 18, 1847. From that inventory, Mary Nichols set aside certain

items to keep for herself before the remaining items were sold at public auction. The total value of the property she retained was appraised at \$56.68, and an invoice for that amount was presented to her by the court. Since William Nichols had been a carpenter, much of his property included various tools of his trade, such as saws, planes, axes, chisels, etc. Mary Nichols kept a few of his tools, but also selected to keep several other items including two cows (appraised at \$8.00), one chest (\$2.50), one clock (\$2.00), one press (\$5.00), table and chairs (\$2.25), and a considerable number of books (\$9.37). It's interesting to note that William Nichols' inventory of books was appraised at a higher value than the two milk cows.

Notes for MARY A. ROUNDTREE:

Shortly after the death of her husband, Mary Nichols took most of her children and went to live with her parents, whose farm was located some 150 miles west in Buchanan County, Missouri. Her oldest son, Elvin J. Nichols, who had married Polly Hawkins, remained behind in Boone County. Mary would reside in Buchanan County, Missouri until after the death of her mother, in 1853, at which time she returned to Boone County once again and lived there until her death in 1870. She never remarried despite the fact that she was only 39 when William died.

There is a three page letter in the files of the Missouri State Archives in Jefferson City, Missouri, written by Mary Nichols to her son, Elvin, while she was living in Buchanan County. The letter is dated February 9, 1850, and is very difficult to read because of the script and spelling errors. Following is a transcription of parts of the letter exactly as written by Mary Nichols:

Buchanon County, February 9, 1850

Dear Children, I embrace the opportunity of writing to you this morning. This leaves us awl in good health at this time. I am in hopes this finds you enjoying the same. Your letter I received on Saturday. It was a great satisfaction to hear from you and your family. You rote word you have not heard from us since last fawel. When I received your letter that I got last fawel, I sent it to the office Christmast eve, and I asigned the note you sent to me and put it in the letter as you recuested me to do, and I will asign this for fear you won't get that and send in this letter. We have had a pleasant winter to what it was last winter. Peple are intirely healthy at this time. I have nothing of importance to wright more than we have aplenty of meat and bread and good appetite. You wanted to know how I was living and what was doing. I am getting as well as could be expected. For children to do we have three milk cows and nine head of shwepe and one ram and two shoats. Intend to buy me some stock hogs this fawel if I live and four shwepes. Thought it would be best to settle myself before I buy. I am living on mothers land and expect to stay on it long as she lives. Your granmother sends hear love to you and Poly an to hear little great granchildren. I have heard from your uncle Columbus abut a month go. He was in California and was the richest man thear and was diging goald. Elvin, you talk of gowing to California. My advice to you stay with your little family. If you war a young man I would advise you to gow. Since I comence writing Wilford Stevenson come to see me and carry with him this ar letter.

Elvin want you to sewel the cow and the shwepe and send me the money if thear is any comeing to me. I want you to pay ___ King and ___ Mayo and make yourself safe. If thear should be any more send it to me buy Wilford Stevenson. You must not let my little granchldrn forget thear granmother. The children sends thear love to you awl. Poly you must write to me as swan as you receave this. Elvin wright as soon as you receave this. I should like to hear from you every month. I must come to a clause. Nothing more. I remain your loving mother until death.

(signed) Mary Nichols

The 1850 U.S. Census for Crawford Township, Buchanan County, Missouri listed Mary A. Nicholas, age 46, head of household, and the following children: James Nicholas, age 21, William, age 18, Samuel, age 17, Alexander, age 15, Amanda, age 13, Martha, age 12, Elias N., age 10, George H., age 8, and Susan, age 4. In the dwelling next to Mary Nichols lived her mother, Susan Roundtree, age 63. Also living nearby in the household of the Daniel Shoop family was another daughter, Virginia Nichols, age 22.

By 1860, Mary Nichols had returned to Boone County, Missouri with her children. The 1860 census for Missouri Township listed Mary Nichols, age 53, head of household and farming, a daughter, Amanda, age 21, a son, Milton B., age 22, and a daughter, Mary S., age 13. The value of her real estate was listed as \$1000 and personal property at \$600.

Following is a transcription of the last will and testament of Mary A. Nichols. The original was signed by her and dated January 11, 1870, approximately six weeks prior to her death. (Estate No. 2538, Missouri State Archives, Jefferson City, Missouri.)

In the name of God, Amen

Know all men by these presents that I, Mary A. Nichols, being of sound and disposing mind, and knowing the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, do make and publish this my last will and testament.

1st. It is my will that all of my property both real and personal be sold by my executor at public sale; that my real estate to wit: 50 acres, north part, west half of southwest quarter of Section 19, Township 49, Range 13, be sold at public sale at the courthouse in the town of Columbia after twenty days public notice of the time, place and terms of sale, and of a description of the property to be sold by advertisement in some newspaper published in Boone County, for cash. My personal property to be sold also for cash in hand.

2nd. Out of the proceeds of such sales I will that all of my just debts be paid and that the balance of the proceeds of such sale, after paying all my just debts and all costs of executing this will, shall be invested in tombstones to be set at the head and feet of the graves of myself, my deceased husband, William Nichols, and my two deceased children, John Franklin Nichols and Columbus H. Nichols.

3rd. I hereby constitute and appoint my son, Elvin Nichols, as my Executor to execute, carry out and fulfill the provisions of this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I hereto set my hand and affix my seal this 11th day of January, 1870.

(signed) Mary A. Nichols

Mary A. Nichols died on February 8, 1870 in Boone County, Missouri at the age of 62 years old. She was buried next to her husband in the New Providence Baptist Church cemetery.

Notes for JOHN FRANKLIN NICHOLS:

John Franklin Nichols died in infancy, but his grave has yet to be found and no dates have been established for him. In her Last Will and Testament, Mary A. Nichols stated that proceeds from her estate should be invested in tombstones for her deceased husband, William Nichols, and her two deceased children, John Franklin Nichols and Columbus H. Nichols. The grave for Columbus H. Nichols is located in New Providence Cemetery, and it seems likely that John Franklin was buried there as well although no stone for him has been found.

2. ELVIN JEFFERSON⁴ NICHOLS (*WILLIAM FRANKLIN³, JOHN², UNKNOWN¹*) was born April 29, 1825 in Barren County, Kentucky, and died November 03, 1894 in Boone County, Missouri. He married **MARY ANN "POLLY" HAWKINS** March 25, 1845 prob. in Boone County, Missouri, daughter of JAMES HAWKINS and NANCY TOMLIN. She was born December 08, 1828 in Boone County, Missouri, and died July 15, 1889 in Boone County, Missouri.

Notes for ELVIN JEFFERSON NICHOLS:

The following biographical sketch was taken from "History of Boone County, Missouri," by James S. Rollins, and, according to the fly leaf, was "written and compiled from the most authentic and private sources." (Published by the Western Historical Company, St. Louis, Missouri, 1882).

"E. J. Nichols, farmer and stock trader, was born in Barren County, Kentucky, April 29, 1825. He came to Boone County, Missouri, with his parents, arriving at their destination in the month of December, 1829. They settled five miles northeast of Columbia on a small tributary of the Perche, called the Rocky Fork, where the subject of this sketch grew to manhood. The little education he received was obtained at

subscription schools which were attended at long intervals. The elder Nichols being a carpenter, Elvin was brought up to that trade, and assisted his father in the shop when not working on the farm. He remained with his parents until he had attained his majority, when he began to work for himself. March 25, 1845, he was married to Miss Polly Ann, daughter of James and Nancy Hawkins, pioneer settlers of Boone County. After his marriage, Mr. Nichols settled on the farm he now occupies, in the northern part of Missouri Township, containing 450 acres. In 1850 he made an overland trip to California, where he remained one year working in the mines. He then took passage on a sail vessel for home. While off the coast of Lower California, the vessel was caught in a fierce western gale and was blown 1,500 miles to sea, prolonging the voyage sixty-seven days. There were 370 passengers, necessitating a short allowance of food and water for many days. The portion allowed to each individual finally dwindled to one pint of water and two crackers once in twenty-four hours. The tropical heat was severe and many sickened and died of fever ere they reached port.

"Arriving at Panama, he and several others attempted to walk to Chagares, but gave out on the way. They were compelled to purchase a mule ere they reached their destination. From Chagares he sailed for New Orleans in a steamer, arriving home in April, 1851. From 1860 to 1872, Mr. Nichols bought and shipped stock to eastern markets, his shipping points being Concordia, Columbia and Sturgeon. In 1873 he bought and fed a herd of cattle in Saline County, and in 1878 he handled over 200,000 pounds of pork which he sold in eastern markets. In 1864 he was drafted as a soldier in the Union army, but hired a substitute. During the same year he was arrested on a charge of giving aid and comfort to Bill Anderson's guerillas, and was taken to Macon City and put in prison. He soon gave bail and was set at liberty. He has eight children. The oldest son, William Hite, is a Baptist minister, a graduate of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville, Kentucky; John J.; Nancy A., wife of Henry Naylor; George Martin, a medical student of the State University; Rhoanna, wife of Samuel Morris; Eddie E., Robert E. L. and Overton. Mr. Nichols and his wife and their children are members of the Baptist Church."

The 1850 U.S. Census for District No. 8, Boone County, Missouri listed Elvin Nichols, age 25, a farmer and head of the household, his wife, Polly A., age 22, a daughter, Sarah E. age 3, and a daughter, Mary F., age 1 year old. The value of real estate owned by Elvin Nichols was listed as \$600.

The 1860 census for Missouri Township, Boone County listed Elvin J. Nichols, age 36, his wife, Polly A., age 31, a daughter, Sarah E., age 12, a son, William, age 8, a son, John F., age 4, and a daughter, Nancy A., age 2 years. His real estate was valued at \$3000. and his personal property was listed at \$1300.

The 1870 census for Township Forty Nine, Boone County, Missouri listed Elvin Nichols, age 45, a farmer and head of the family, his wife, Polly A., age 45, a son, William, age 19, a son, John, age 15, a daughter, Nancy, age 13, a son, Martin, age 10, a daughter, Roann, age 6, a son, Edward, age 4, and a son, Robert, age 2 years. The value of Elvin's real estate was appraised as \$6000 and his personal property was valued at \$2000. Also living in the household was George Naylor, age 35, a school teacher, and Mary Sutton, age 21, helping with the housework.

Elvin and Polly Nichols added an additional son to their family as can be seen from the 1880 census. Named are E. J. Nichols, age 55, a farmer and head of the household, his wife, P.A., age 51, a son, M. G., age 19, farming, a daughter, R. A., age 16, a son, E. E., age 14, a son, R. L., age 12, and a son, O., age 9 years. Also living in the household was M. Sutton, age 30, hired help. By the year 1880, two of Elvin's children, William Hite, age 29, and Nancy Abigail, age 22, had married and started families of their own. Another son, John Jefferson, age 25, was living in the household of Mrs. Willhite, a widow, helping her on the farm.

Elvin J. Nichols died on November 3, 1894 at the age of 69 years old. He is buried in the New

Providence Baptist Church Cemetery in Boone County.

3. JAMES T.⁴ NICHOLS (*WILLIAM FRANKLIN³, JOHN², UNKNOWN¹*) was born January 1827 in the state of Missouri, and died aft. 1900 prob. in Boone County, Missouri. He married **(1) NANCY SMITH** October 30, 1851 in Boone County, Missouri. She was born 1833 in the state of Missouri, and died bet. 1872 - 1874 in state of Missouri. He married **(2) ELLEN J. HOLMES** May 17, 1874 in Boone County, Missouri. She was born February 1846 in the state of Missouri.

Notes for JAMES T. NICHOLS:

The 1860 census for Missouri Township, Boone County, Missouri listed James Nichols, age 30, his wife, Nancy, age 27, a son, William, age 4, a son, John, age 1 year, and a new baby (not named), age 2 months old. James was shown as not owning real estate but renting instead, and his personal property was valued at \$250.

The 1870 U.S. Census for Township Forty Nine, Boone County, Missouri listed James Nicholas, age 41, a farmer and head of the household, his wife, Nancy, age 37, a son, William, age 13, a son, Mack, age 11, a son, Robert, age 9, a son, Jesse, age 7, a son, John, age 5, and a son, Bailey, age 2 years. The census record shows that James owned no real estate, but his personal property was valued at \$200.

By the time of the next census in 1880, James Nichols' first wife, Nancy, had died and James had remarried to Ellen Holmes and had a daughter by her. The 1880 census for Missouri Township, Boone County, Missouri listed James Nichols, age 52, a farmer and head of the household, his wife, E. J., age 35, a son, William, age 22 and a farmer, a son, Newt E., age 20 and a farmer, a son, R. S., age 18 and farming at home, a son, J. Lee, age 13 and a farmer, a son, J., age 12, a son, R., age 8, a daughter, E., age 10, and a daughter, M. E., age 1 year.

The 1900 census for Missouri Township, Boone County, Missouri listed James Nichols, age 73, his wife, Ellen, age 54, and a son, Green N., age 11. The couple had been married for 25 years, and there had been three children, but only two were still living.

William Hite Nichols married Frances Ellen "Fannie" Lindsey on August 14, 1873 in Boone County, Missouri. He was 21 and she was 15 when they married. Five years later the Rev. William H. Nichols was ordained to the Baptist ministry on September 29, 1878 at the New Providence Baptist Church located about seven miles northwest of Columbia, Missouri. He was 26 years old.

The 1880 U.S. Census for Centralia, Boone County, Missouri listed William Nichols, age 29, a minister and head of the family, his wife, Frances, age 21, and a daughter, Stella, age 2 years. Also living in the home was Sallie Lindsey, age 26, a cousin.

Frances Nichols died from tuberculosis on April 18, 1881, at the age of 22. The couple had been married for almost eight years and their baby daughter, Stella, was not quite four years old when her mother died. Stella was subsequently taken in by her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Lindsey, and then later went to live with an aunt and uncle and was raised by them.

In 1882, William H. Nichols graduated from the School of Systematic Theology of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. While there he also studied Old Testament English, New Testament English and Homiletics. While he was attending the Baptist Seminary in Louisville he met his second wife, Mary Emma Earl, and they were married in Louisville on April 12, 1882.

In November of 1882, Rev. William H. Nichols had a church in Hopkins, Missouri and was still there two years later because his son, William D., was born in Hopkins on July 17, 1884. Other churches were Tallula, Illinois in November of 1884; Sabetta, Kansas in April of 1886; Parla, Kansas in 1889; and Oklahoma City, Indian Territory in April of 1890. (source was the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.)

The 1890 First Territorial Census of Oklahoma, Enumeration District No. 43 of Oklahoma City listed William H. Nichols, age 38, head of the family, his wife, Mary E., age 26, a daughter, Clara M., age 7, and a son, Will D., age 5 years old.

The 1900 census for Ward 5, Oklahoma County, Indian Territory, listed William H. Nichols, age 49, head of the family, his wife, Mary E., age 37, and a son, William D., age 15. The couple had been married for 20 years, and both of their children were still living.

It is believed that William H. Nichols and Mary Emma Nichols were either separated or contemplating separation at the time the 1900 census, because Mary E. also appears in the 1900 census for Louisville, Kentucky, listed as living in the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Earl. Her daughter, Clara May, was also living with the Earls in 1900 while her son, William, Jr. remained in Oklahoma City.

Mary Emma (Earl) Nichols appears twice in the 1900 U. S. Census, once with her husband and son in Oklahoma City, Territory, and a second time with her daughter and parents in Louisville, Kentucky. The 1900 census for Ward 12, Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky lists Abraham Earl, age 68, head of the household and a landlord, his wife, Nancy J., age 58, and a daughter, Clara P., age 39, a school teacher. Also living in the home were their daughter, Emma Nichols, age 36, a music teacher, and granddaughter, Clara M., age 17 years. The Earls had been married for 41 years, and all five of their children were still living. Emma Nichols is shown as a widow, and two of her three children were still living. (Note: It seems likely that Emma Nichols was either back east visiting with her parents at the time of the 1900 census report, or she and William had separated, and she had moved back to her parent's home. Meanwhile, her husband, William H. Nichols, was living in Oklahoma City with their son, and reported his wife as a part of their household there.)

The 1910 census for Precinct 16, Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky listed Abraham B. Earl, age 77, head of the family, his wife, Nancy J., age 66, and a daughter, Clara P., age 46. Also living in the home was a daughter, Emma Nichols, age 40, a widow and a music teacher. The census report indicated that only one of Emma Nichols' three children was still living. (William D. Nichols had died earlier in Oklahoma City.) The only surviving child was her daughter, Clara May Nichols Roehr, age 26, who had married in 1903 and was living with her husband in the household next door.

"My Grandfather Nichols had not been awarded the family farm in Boone County that he had understood would be his inheritance. This left my grandmother angry, but that anger was seldom expressed and did not affect her disposition. However, she had little to do with the Nichols in-laws. O. F. Nichols had the demeanor, I am told, of a fairly wealthy young man about town. When he was courting his future wife, Harriett Elizabeth Drake, who's father was the town doctor in Ashland, Missouri, it is said that he came down the "Ashland Gravel," a toll road, with the finest horse and polished carriage to court her. I could imagine that they had expected a life of some comfort and ease, but life did not turn out that way for them.

"When he did not get the family farm that was promised him, my grandfather turned to the buying of walnut logs, a major Missouri resource with a ready market. He did well at that business. They built what was then a fine house, not luxurious, but one of the most modern houses in their town of Hallsville, Missouri. Hallsville is about 15 miles north of Columbia where the University is located. My grandmother had a flair for artistic endeavors and opened a shop making women's hats. They proceeded to raise eight children in that house. All but the oldest, Adelia, went to college, and most finished. All lived lives marked with a good bit of fortune and happiness. Crisis moments were marked out in everyone's memory: The death of Adelia's youngest son, Jack, when very young. Adelia (Dee) was nearly killed in an auto accident. The ethos of the family was based on doing whatever you did well, and maybe the best. Grandmother said, "Even a poor man can wash his face."

"When several of the girls were in school, O. F. and his wife, "Aunt Bess," moved to Columbia, probably for better access to the University. As the log business slowed, my grandfather turned to farming, and his wife rented a very large house and took in roomers and boarders. My grandmother fed as many as 40 college men three meals a day with only the help of a little woman named Christine. The house I remember best in my childhood was only one house removed from the main campus of the University. There was always food on the table for anyone who came, and both my grandmother and grandfather were possessed of a great sense of humor so that the spirit of their household was always high. On the front porch every summer evening my Grandfather Nichols sat in a wicker rocker and smoked his cigars, from somewhere there was always family around, and there was always laughter. A highlight of my year was the family Christmas gathering and the many presents. Grandfather brought in a huge cedar tree from the farm, and family came from near and far. Even Jewel from California! In the early 1940's, that was an event.

"I remember most vividly the day my grandmother came home with a new 1939 Plymouth. The first car I had seen with the shifter on the steering post! I was dying to ride in it, but my grandmother said, "Not until you tell me whether you are a Democrat or a Republican." No one in the family would tell me the right answer. But eventually I figured it out and claimed my ride. She was, of course, a Democrat!"

"During World War II my grandfather was sought out by Mr. Ole Fahlin, who manufactured airplane propellers, because of my grandfather's knowledge of wood. He managed the preparation of wood for the Fahlin factory until the war's end when the plant closed."

L., age 5 years and 6 months. Census records indicated that the couple owned their own home.

57, as head of the household and a farmer, and his wife, Bessie, age 54. Also living in the household was Henry Carlos, age 26, a laborer.

O. F. Nichols, 90, of 610 Paris Court died early yesterday evening at the Rector Nursing Home after an illness of several months.

He was born in the Midway community on August 16, 1871, to Elvin J. and Polly Ann Hawkins Nichols. He was married to the former Miss Bessie Drake of Ashland August 8, 1894. She died last June 12.

He was a member of Missouri Methodist Church, and received a 50-year pin from the Columbia Lodge 207 of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows a few years ago. He was a retired buyer of lumber.

Survivors include two sons, O. D. Nichols of Kansas City and R. L. Nichols of Scotia, New York; five daughters, Mrs. I. B. Jones of 1403 Paris Road, Mrs. Charles Morganthaler of Gettysburg, Pa., Mrs. J. A. Street of Houston, Tex., Mrs. Charles Ernst of Long Beach, Calif., and Mrs. Loren Mills of Hannibal; nine grandchildren; and 13 great-grandchildren. One daughter, Mrs. Harold LeMert, died previously.

Funeral services will be at 11 a.m. Monday at the Memorial Funeral Home chapel with Rev. Monk Bryan of Missouri Methodist Church officiating. Burial will be in the New Salem cemetery near Ashland. Sons and son-in-laws will serve as pallbearers. The body will be at the funeral home until time for burial.

The 1900 census for Oklahoma City, Oklahoma listed George Hales, age 40, a horse dealer and head of the family, his wife, Fannie, age 33, a daughter, Jesse, age 17, a daughter, Frankie L., age 15, a son, Willie, age 13, and a son, Earl, age 9 years old. According to the census record, the couple had been married for 18 years, and all four of their children were still living.

Jesse Jane Hales came from a prominent family in Oklahoma City and was only 6 years old when, along with her parents, she participated in the Oklahoma land run of 1889. She was called "Dadda" by family members, and during her lifetime, she was widowed three times and lived to be 104 years old. Her first marriage was to William D. Nichols in Oklahoma City on August 26, 1903. At the time, she was 20 and he was 19 years old. Unfortunately, that union lasted only about three years when William Nichols died of illness on December 21, 1906, leaving Jesse with two infant children. After the death of her husband, she moved back into the home with her parents.

The 1910 census for Ward 6, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma named George Hales, age 50, a buyer and head of the household, his wife, Fanny, age 43, a daughter and a widow, Jesse Nichols, age 27, a roomer, Frankie May Nichols, age 6, and a roomer, George Downing Nichols, age 4. The census record stated that Jesse Nichols had a total of two children, and both were still living.

About 1918, Jesse married a second time to Dr. Dana L. Hunt, a teacher, who was 20 years older than her. Shortly after they were married, the family relocated to Eau Claire, Wisconsin where Dr. Hunt was proprietor of the Hunt Business College where he also taught courses. The 1920 census for Eau Claire, Wisconsin listed Dana L. Hunt, age 54, head of the household, employed as a teacher at a business college, his wife, Jesse J., age 34, a daughter, Frankie Mae N., age 15, and a son, William Downing N., age 13. Sometime in the early 1920's (possibly 1922), Dana Hunt died leaving Jesse a widow once again. In the meantime, Jesse's daughter, Frankie Mae Nichols, married Edwin T. Daisley on June 26, 1926, and the following year the couple moved to Des Moines, Iowa, and Jesse went with them.

The 1930 census for Ward 1, Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa listed Edwin T. Daisley, age 31, head of the household, employed as the manager of Kresge 5 & 10 cents store, his wife, Frankie M., age 25, a son, Edwin T. Jr., age 1 year, 7 months, a son, David N., age 3 months, a maid, Hazel Mersch, age 27, a widow, and his mother-in-law, Jesse Hunt, age 46, a widow.

Jesse Hunt left Des Moines, Iowa in the early 1930's and returned to live in Oklahoma City. One day in the early 1940's, her doorbell rang, and when she opened the door she found a man holding a bouquet of flowers in front of his face. His name was John Grunawalt, and apparently he had been a suitor of hers back when they were young. He lived in southern California and was visiting in Oklahoma City when he heard that Jesse was back and was a widow. When she opened the door and asked who was there, he moved the flowers aside and said, "I've come to get you Jesse Jane!" Later (not sure of the time interval), they were married, and Jesse moved back to California with him. John Grunawalt was a builder and real estate developer and also owned several gas stations. He died in California about 1948, and Jesse returned to Oklahoma City shortly thereafter.

In 1951, her name appeared in the Oklahoma City Directory as Jesse J. Grunawalt, widow of J. C., residing at 2709 NW 30th Street. The following year she had moved her residence to 429 NW 34th Street, and she continued to live at that address until 1973, when she moved to West Palm

Beach, Florida. Jesse Jane Grunawalt died on May 6, 1987 at the age of 104 and is buried at Resthaven Cemetery in Des Moines, Iowa.

Keen Johnson, the 42nd Governor of Kentucky, was a journalist, and business executive as well as a politician. His earliest teacher was his father, Robert Johnson, a circuit riding preacher of the Methodist Church, whose profession took the family throughout western Kentucky. In the fall of 1914 and over the next three years, he pursued his academic studies at Central Methodist College, Fayette, Missouri. While there he married Eunice Lee Nichols, on June 23, 1917. She was the daughter of Dr. Robert Lee Nichols and Mary Avery Nichols of neighboring Higbee, Missouri. Eunice Nichols' father, a physician, had died when she was nine months old.

When America entered World War I, Johnson enrolled in the Reserve Officer's Training Camp at Fort Riley, Kansas, where he was commissioned second lieutenant, Infantry, on August 15, 1917. He was assigned to active duty with the 354th Infantry, 89th Division, and promoted to first lieutenant, Infantry, on March 29, 1918. He embarked for France on June 4, 1918, where he would spend considerable time receiving instruction in logistical communications at the Army School of the Line and Staff College in Langres. After the armistice he remained in Europe with the Allied Expeditionary Force until April, 1919, and was honorably discharged, October 31, 1919.

Following his discharge Johnson began his career in journalism. He purchased The Mirror, a weekly newspaper at Elizabethtown, Kentucky, and operated it for one year. The 1920 U.S. Census for District 206, Elizabethtown, Hardin County, Kentucky lists Keen Johnson, age 25, and his wife, Eunice N., age 24. He then enrolled at the University of Kentucky completing his A.B. degree in Journalism in 1922. While attending the university, he worked part-time as a reporter for the Lexington Herald. Following graduation he bought an interest in The Anderson News at Lawrenceburg, Kentucky and published and edited the newspaper until he moved to Richmond in 1925. There he purchased half interest in the Richmond Daily Register and served as editor and co-publisher from 1925 until 1939. He continued to write many of the newspaper's editorials until the late 1960's. The couple's only child, a daughter, Judith, was born on May 19, 1927 in Richmond.

Johnson's political career began in 1932 when he was elected secretary of the Democratic State Central and Executive Committee. His importance and strength in the state Democratic party grew, and in 1935 he was elected as Lieutenant Governor in the administration of Governor A. B. "Happy" Chandler. He

announced his candidacy for governor on May 17, 1939, and fought a bitter primary campaign against John Y. Brown, Sr., winning by 32,000 votes. However, when U.S. Senator Marvin Mills Logan died on October 3rd, Governor Chandler resigned, and Johnson took the oath as governor. His first official act was to appoint Chandler to fill Logan's unexpired Senate term. Then, on November 17, Johnson was elected for a full term, defeating Republican King Swope of Lexington by more than 100,000 votes. Keen Johnson was inaugurated on December 12, 1939, as Kentucky's forty-second governor and served for four years until December, 1943.

After Johnson left the governor's office, he joined the Reynolds Metals Company as a special assistant to President Richard Samuel Reynolds, Sr., advising him on postwar unemployment problems. In 1945 he became Vice President for Public Relations. In 1946, Johnson took leave of absence from Reynolds and was appointed by President Harry Truman to the newly created position of Undersecretary of Labor. IN 1947, he returned to Reynolds and resumed his vice-presidency, and in 1950 became a member of the Board of Directors. He retired from Reynolds in January, 1961.

Keen Johnson served as a member of the Democratic National Committee from 1940 to 1948, and he engaged in his last political campaign in 1960 when he ran for a seat in the U.S. Senate. Again he defeated his longtime opponent, John Y. Brown, Sr., in the primary but lost to the Republican incumbent, John Sherman Cooper, in the November general election.

Over the years, Johnson served with various professional, fraternal, social, and military organizations. He was president of the Kentucky Press Association and was elected a member of the Kentucky Journalism Hall of Fame. He belonged to the National Press Club and the Metropolitan Club in Washington, D.C., Pendennis Club, Keeneland Club, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, 40 and 8, Masonic F. and A.M., Rotary, Elks, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Omicron Delta Kappa, Sigma Delta Chi, and Scabbard and Blade. The University of Kentucky awarded Johnson an honorary doctor of laws degree in 1940 and later a Centennial Award. He served for eight years as a member of the Eastern Kentucky University Board of Regents where he received a Distinguished Service Plaque. The Keen Johnson Building, located on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University in Richmond, was named for him and is well known for its clock tower.

William Downing Nichols' father became ill and passed away in Oklahoma City in December 1906, when William Jr. was just 10 months old. After his father's death, his mother, Jesse, moved herself and the children back with her parents, the George Hales, in Oklahoma City, where they would reside until Jesse married again about 1918. William's new step-father, Dr. Dana L. Hunt, was a teacher, and the family relocated to Eau Claire, Wisconsin where Dr. Hunt was proprietor and a teacher at the Hunt Business College.

It was while living in Eau Claire as a teenager that William D. Nichols was seriously injured. He was playing basketball and crashed very hard into the basketball goal standard, crushing his left kidney. At that time (early 1920's), the general belief among the medical profession was that two functioning kidneys were necessary in order to survive, so the outlook was not good. After a long and innovative surgery that involved an 18 - 24 month hospital stay, he was finally released in a wheelchair with the prognosis that he would never walk again. He was 5'11" tall and weighed between 75 and 80 lbs. His aunt and uncle (W. T. and Neta Hales) owned a home in southern California, an estate located right on the Pacific Ocean, and they invited him to recuperate out there. His Aunt Neta hired a nurse and a therapist, and William would crawl on the beach, swim and squeeze rubber balls in his hands to help regain his strength. A year later, he was back to his normal weight, walked without a limp, and made the football team at USC until the coach found out about his having only one kidney and forced him to quit the team.

William D. Nichols never graduated from USC. His brother-in-law, Eddie Daisley, suggested he come to work for Kresge and helped him get a manager's position with the company in New York. The 1930 census for West New York, Hudson County, New Jersey lists William D. Nichols, age 26, head of the household, employed as a manager of a department store. He rented his home located on East Boulevard. Also living in the household was George P. Clark, age 28, a roomer.

Meanwhile, William's mother, Jesse, was in Des Moines, Iowa visiting her daughter, Frankie Daisley, when she met Lola Geil at a party. Shortly afterward, she called William in New York and said that he had to come to Des Moines for a visit because she had just met the young woman the he was going to marry. Long story short, they were married in August 1930, and Lola moved to New York. The couple's first child, Patricia Ann, was born May 28, 1933, in New Britain, Connecticut.

William D. Nichols was transferred to Detroit, Michigan with Kresge. He was issued Social Security Card No. 363-09-9805 in the state of Michigan. Another daughter, Karen Sue, was born on September 10, 1938 in Detroit. William Nichols left the Kresge Company and went to work for Montgomery Ward and moved to Fremont, Ohio in 1940-1941 as manager in one of their stores. Over the next few years he was transferred to Alpino, Michigan, Battle Creek, Michigan, Maysville, Kentucky, Portsmouth, Ohio, and finally, Lima, Ohio, in 1946. He left Montgomery Ward in 1947 and returned to Oklahoma City as a manager with John A. Brown Department Stores. In 1951, he was transferred to New York City to manage Brown's New York office. He resigned from Brown's in 1954.

In 1954, William D. Nichols was mentioned in his aunt's will as residing in Oklahoma City. The aunt was Clara Mae (Nichols) Roehr who died in Louisville, Kentucky.

For a while after leaving Brown's, William Nichols and Lola lived in Phoenix, Arizona, where he became a realtor, specializing in shopping center development. Later, they returned to Oklahoma City again, and William accepted the position of Vice President and Manager of John A. Brown and opened the first suburban shopping center store at Penn Square. His name, along with his wife, Lola, appears in the Oklahoma City Directory each year until 1974. He retired from Brown's in 1973, at the age of 67, and he and Lola returned to the Phoenix area.

William D. Nichols had elective hip replacement surgery in May of 1973 at St. Joseph's Hospital in Phoenix and died from a blood clot. He is buried at Green Acres Cemetery in Scottsdale, Arizona.

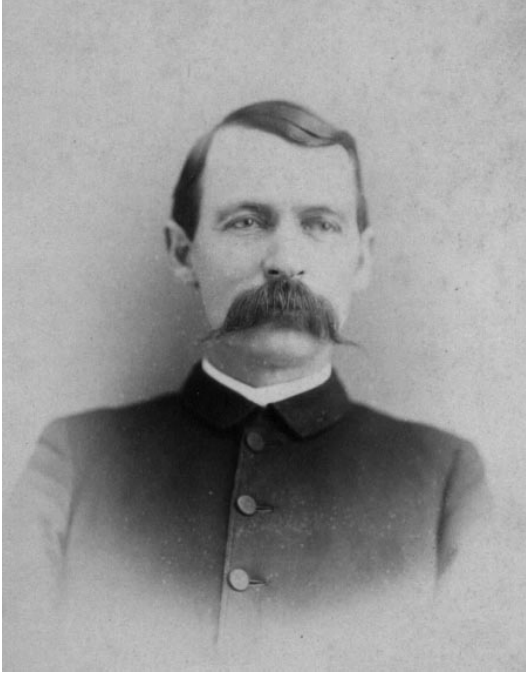

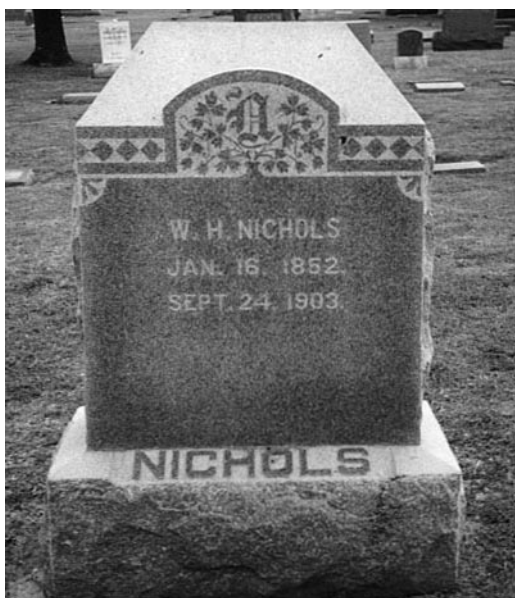

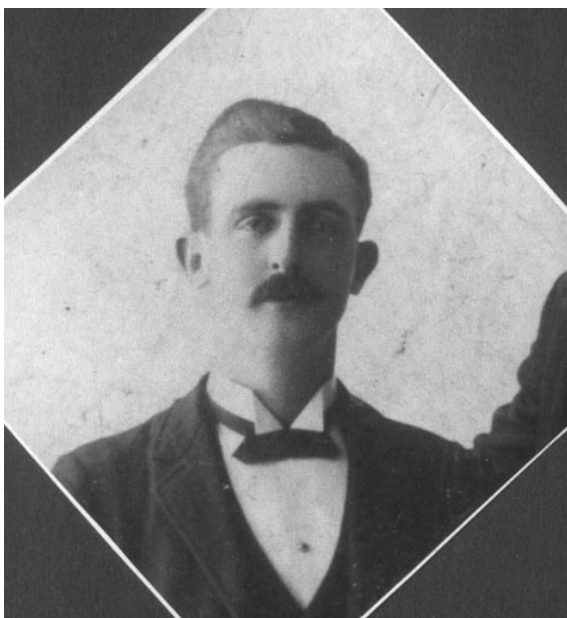

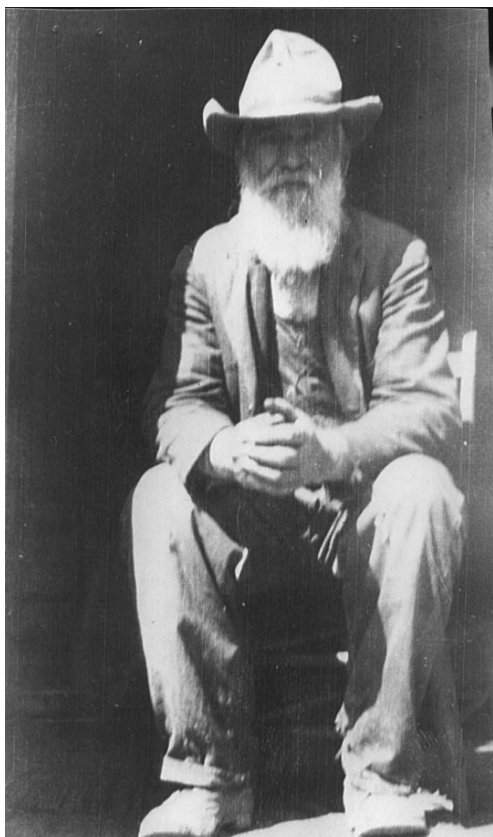

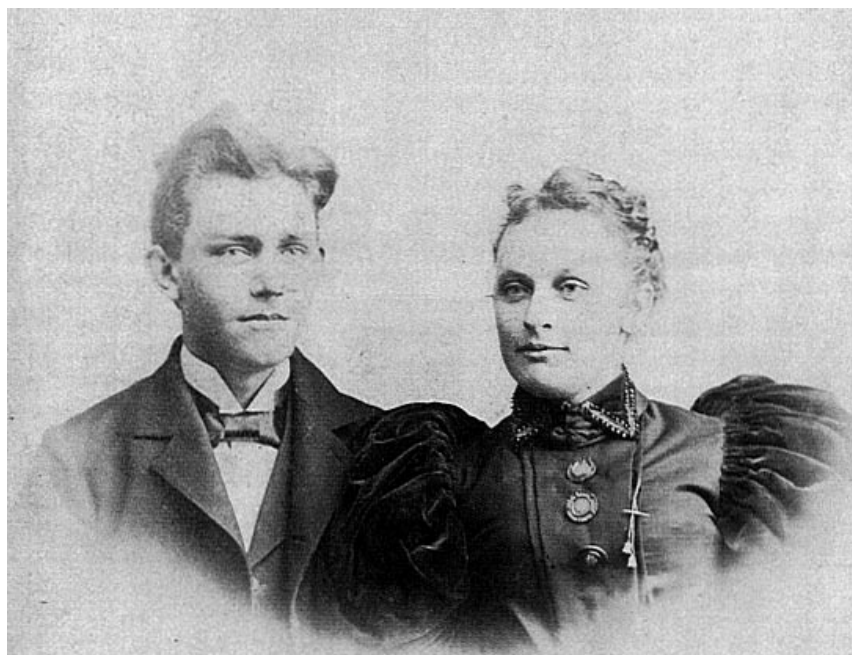

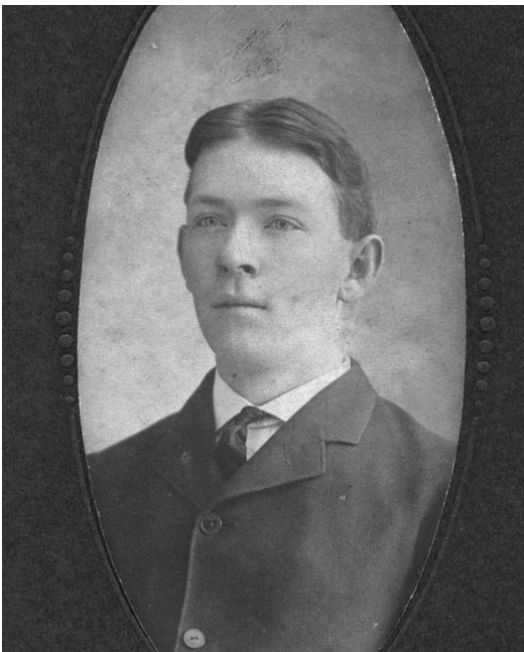

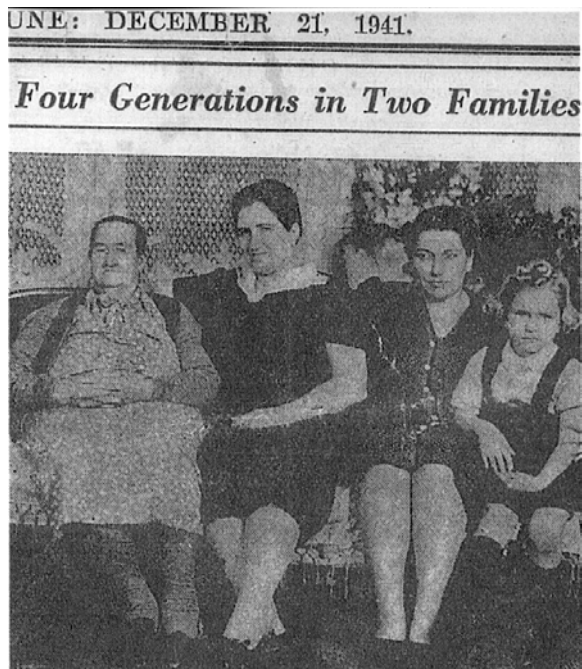

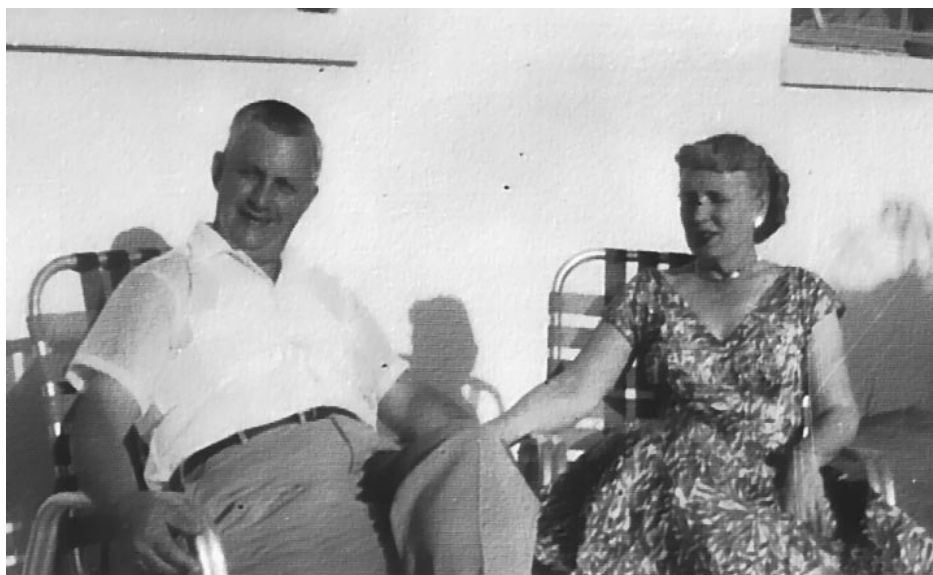

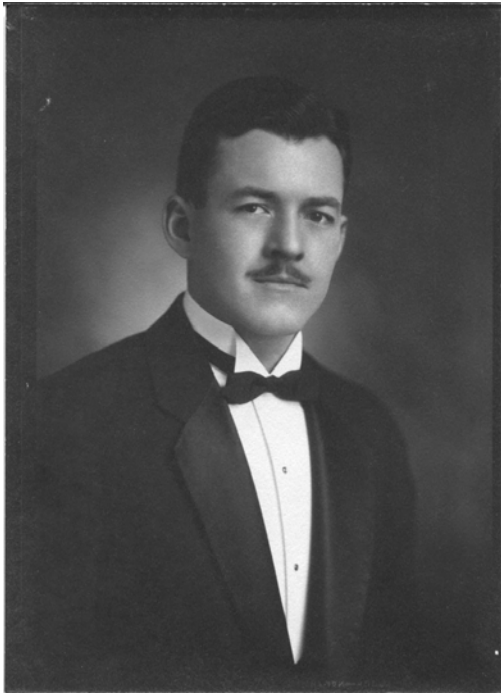

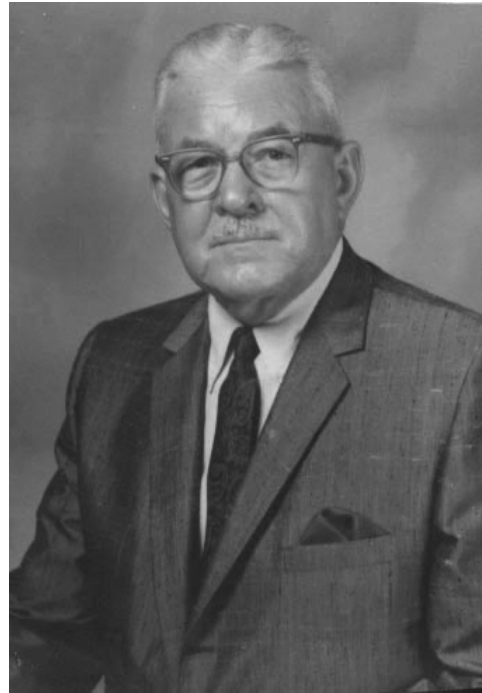

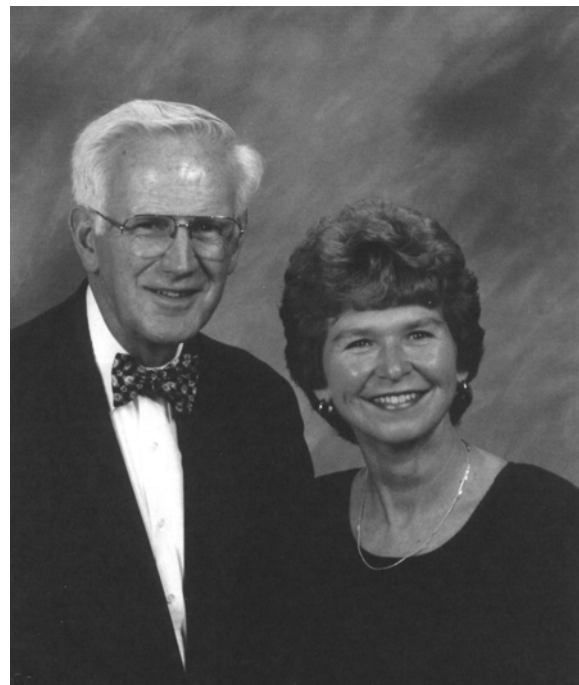

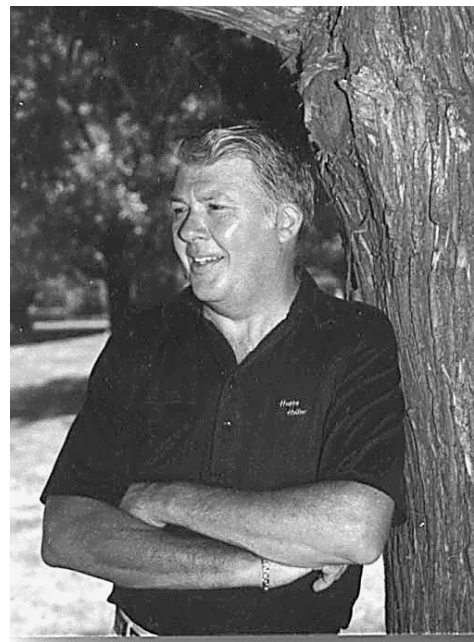

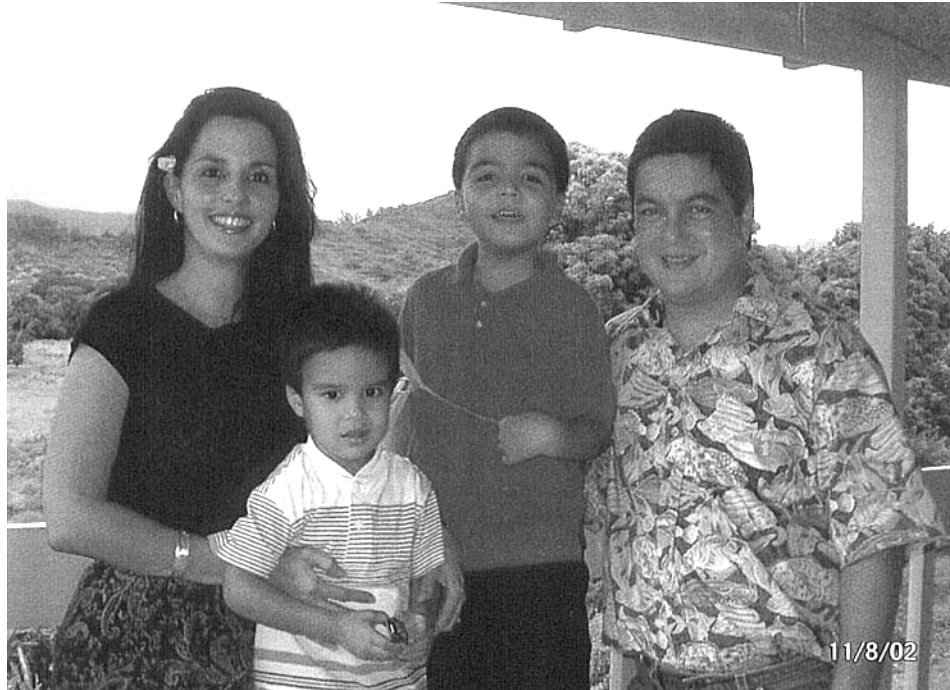

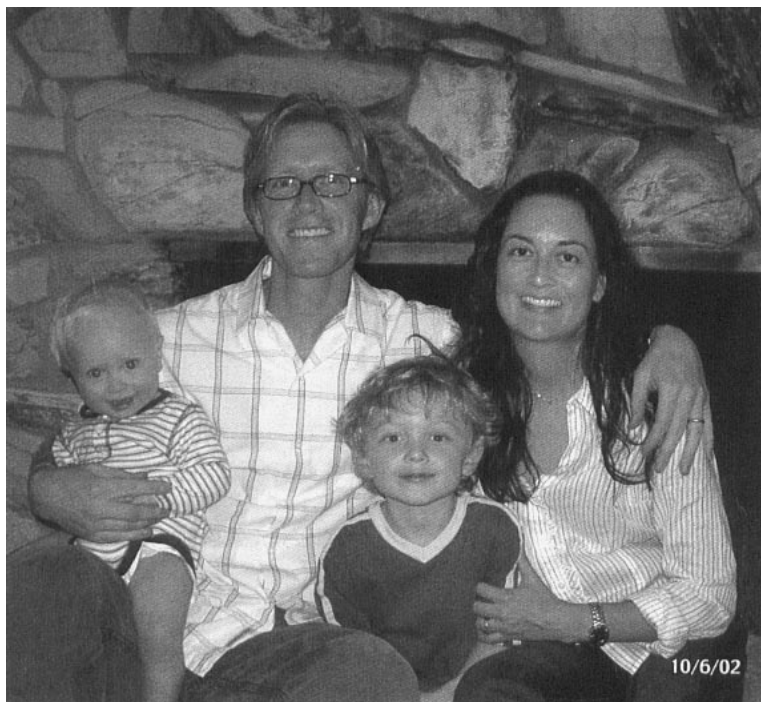
