Mr. James (Jim) Michael Riordan

Our first WWI soldier for this newsletter will be Mr. James (Jim) Michael Riordan, who has always lived at Canmer. His family came to Kentucky from Ireland. He was born November 10, 1891 and died April 15, 1971.

He was the son of Edward and Mary Susan (Sanduskey) Riordan. His brothers and sisters were John, Elizabeth, Ethel, Lillie, Mary, Edna, Catie B., Archie, and Eural.

He registered for WWI on June 5, 1917, then registered for WWII in 1942, when he was 50 years old. He was a farmer. He was laid to rest in the Pearl Webb Cemetery with other members of his family.

Mr. Homer Lee Wells

Mr. Homer Lee Wells is our other WWI soldier for this newsletter. He was born at Rio, KY on February 25, 1892 and died February 10, 1970. He was the son of James Henry and Dollie A. (McFelia) Wells. They had twelve children with eleven still living in 1900. His brothers and sisters were Alice, Charley, Annie Bell, Ermine Wood, Mary Elizabeth, James Robert, Arthur Hansel, Celia E., Rosa May, Oren R., and George Hue.

Mr. Homer married Mary Bettie Reynolds in Indiana on February 22, 1920. He entered WWI on September 18, 1917. He was stationed at Camp Taylor. He was a farmer and living at Hammondsville in 1900. He also registered for WWII and was living at Canmer in 1942. He was buried in Pearl Webb Cemetery with other members of the Wells family.
