Mr. Everett Russell

My first WWI soldier for this newsletter will be Mr. Everett Russell. He was born on September 1, 1894. He was the son of Nichols and Martha B. (Russell). He was one of seven children. His brothers and sisters were Garnett, Beckman, Nettie, Oscar, Joe A., and Stella.

In 1920, he lived at Three Springs. On the 1940 census, he was living on the Stringtown Road. As I remember, he lived where Mr. J.W. Sturgeon lived. He was there when I moved to this community.

He only had a 2nd grade education, but was a very good blacksmith. I remember my brother-in-laws telling about everyone going there to have things made or repaired.

That road was named for an old one room school named Stringtown. I would like to know more about the school, just wish I had asked more questions years ago.

He died on October 7, 1951. Dr. J.W. York was his doctor and Dixon and Rogers of Magnolia buried him. His wife was Mary and his daughter was Ruby. He enlisted in the army on February 22, 1918 and was discharged

on July 18, 1919. He was an engineer in the 84th Division.

Mr. Arthur Ansel Wells

Mr. Arthur Ansel Wells was born on February 25, 1890 in Munfordville, KY. He was the son of James Henry and Dollie Ann (McFelia) Wells. He was a farmer and registered for WWI on June 5, 1917. He went into the service on August 1, 1918 and came out a corporal on June 9, 1919. He lived in Champaign, Illinois for a while. He was brought back to his hometown to be buried in the Pearl Webb Cemetery with his parents.

His mother had died in 1934 and his father died in 1937. His wife was Mary Delia Morgan. He also registered for WWII. He was said to be a very kind person. He died on April 30, 1976. He was one of twelve children.
