The World War II soldiers that I have chosen to write about for this newsletter are Raymond Louis Bale and Claude Allen Biggs.

Raymond Louis Bale was in the navy and Claude Allen Biggs was in the army.

Raymond Louis Bale

Raymond Louis was born December 27, 1921 in Green County and died April 25, 1987 in Louisville, KY.

He was married to Bonita (Bonnie) Puckett. They got married on April 4, 1942 in Indiana. He enlisted in the navy on August 4, 1942 and was discharged on July 19, 1948.

Raymond and Bonnie lived on the south end of Canmer. Although he was born in Green County, Raymond chose to be buried in the Pearl Webb Cemetery at Canmer. He was the son of Elu and Alma Lewis Parish Bale.

We would like to thank him for his service to help keep us free.

Claude Allen Biggs

Claude Allen Biggs was born on November 1, 1915 in Hart County and died on November 21, 1978 in Canmer, KY. He was the youngest of two sons born to James Archie Biggs and his first wife, Virginia (Adams) Biggs.

His older brother, Rober Paul Biggs, was born on August 6, 1913. Claude Allen never married. He worked for his great uncle, Mr. James T. Reynolds, on the farm.

Mr. Reynolds was the older brother of Claude Allen's grandmother, Rosa Ann. She was the wire of Samuel Robert Biggs. Sam and Rosa were the parents of two children: Doy Clinton Biggs, who married Emma Linna Thompson and James Archie Biggs. Mr. Archie was married three times and left a large family.

Claude Allen enlisted in the army at Fort Knox on January 14, 1941. On his tombstone, it says "Tec 5, US Army, WWII. He is buried in the Pearl Webb Cemetery, near where he lived.


